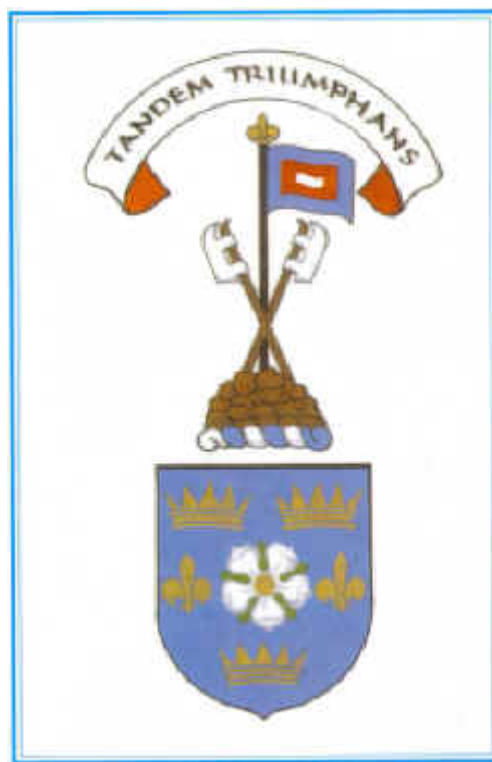

About The 1745 Association

This is a non-political historical association, which exists:

- To mark the appropriate historical sites.

The Association's Annual Gathering

This highlight of the Association's year is the occasion for meeting and greeting members from all parts of the world during a programme of visits and talks about matters of Jacobite interest in the vicinity of the Gathering venue, selected each year for its Jacobite associations. The Gathering is conducted over a weekend in September and consists of visits to places of interest, ranging from battle sites to private country houses with Jacobite connections, an AGM and a very sociable Annual Dinner with musical entertainment, piping and a guest speaker.

The Association's Journal

Three times a year the Association publishes "***The Jacobite***", which is sent to all members. This enjoyable and interesting journal contains articles relating to lesser-known events or personalities of the Jacobite period. Brief articles are welcomed for publication at the Editor's discretion. The journal also includes book reviews and other items of historical interest, usually pertaining to the 18th Century.

No Quarter Given: The Muster Roll of Prince Charles Edward Stuart's Army, 1745-46

The Association compiled the most comprehensive list of all who served in the army of Charles Edward Stuart. The third edition was printed in 2001 by Neil Wilson Publishing, Glasgow.

Other publications and items of interest include postcards of the Coat of Arms illustrated on this leaflet and a 1745 Association lapel badge.

Annual Lecture & Culloden Commemoration

The Association sponsors an annual lecture in April in partnership with the National Trust for Scotland at the Trust's Culloden Visitor Centre, and participates in the annual Culloden Commemoration Service event the following day.

Join the 1745 Association

Single membership is £15.00 and Joint Membership £20.00 per annum. Membership runs from January to January of each year. Your membership will be due for renewal on Jan 01 next year. However, those joining in October to December will be granted 15 months membership for the price of 12, with renewal being necessary at the conclusion of the concessionary period.

Payment may be made by cheque payable to "The 1745 Association". Overseas members with no access to a UK bank account may pay subscriptions by PayPal, an efficient system which does away with the need to use the postal service. Membership fees for this method of payment are £16.00 for single membership and £21.00 for joint. UK members may also use PayPal if they wish. To use PayPal, please refer to the "Join The 1745 Association" page on the website. Alternatively, BACS payment may be made directly to the Association's Bank Account, the details of which are: "The 1745 Association", Sort Code 80-07-17, Account No. 00754609, taking care to identify the sender's full name with the payment.

Failing that, we are prepared to accept subscriptions from overseas in cash in Sterling bank notes or \$US at the rate of \$US30.00 for a single subscription and \$40.00 for a joint membership. Those in the Euro zone may pay in cash at the rate of €25.00 for a single subscription and €30.00 for joint. Cash payments are entirely at the sender's risk and we much prefer a more reliable method of payment.
